Home Director's Report 2025

The 2024-25 season saw the usual WCU events taking place.

The Premier League along with the Under 1850 League took place in Bridgend. It is now noticeable has established the event has become held in a venue with all matches taking place a the same place at the same time compared to the old format of matches being played in various locations. 2024-5 was blighted with more defaulted than in previous seasons, both individual boards and indeed matches. The rules for 2025-6 have been updated to take this into account by giving flexibility to bring in reserve players. Other rules have also been updated for 2025-6.

For future seasons we are looking into a way of avoiding byes by having an even number of teams. This is not as simple as it seems.

Another possibility for future seasons is to use the Saturday of some WCPL weekends to organise a new Junior team event. This will be similar to the Junior 4 NCL with a reduced time control and more rounds on a single day (possibly 3) to make it more attractive to younger players. It may also be more restricted to "beginners". We hope to be able to give this idea a trial run at the end of this season.

The 2025 Welsh Championship was once again held in Cardiff and, for the first time, we were able to broadcast all game in both sections live. This is definitely the way to go for the future for the WCU's most prestigious event.

This leads me to one query with does keep recurring. As you will know we are using two hotel, one in Cardiff and one in Bridgend for a lot of weekend. We have a very good relationship with the conference team and each hotel and this is so helpful when it comes to organising the events. The staff at the hotels know us and, more importantly, know what is required. They also, where possible, offer flexibility on the number of rooms booked allowing us, on occasions, to cancel rooms if numbers are low. This is something that is not on offer for many hotels and the helpfulness of the staff at teach venue is greatly valued and appreciated.

Also, hotel come with refreshments available from bars atc. This facility would probably not be available if we booked a school or community centre.

The cost of venues is another factor, with prices of some places sky-rocketing over the last few years which have taken them way outside our budget.

Finally for this section, it must be remembered the work that goes into setting up events. It is not just a matter of turning up on the event of the event a hoping all goes OK. A lot of preparation takes place in the lead up and indeed through the event and after it has finished. Just to give those present an idea of what is involved.
